ACADEMY PROFILE MAYA KATHERINE

WE HEARD ABOUT MAYA'S PASSION FOR HER PROJECT & THE CHALLENGES SHE FACED, SO OUR CREATIVE COUNCIL

elected to help and adopted Moishe as our first 'Supported by' project; it was a learning curve for both of us! First-time Director Maya Katherine took the plunge to make her incredibly important and personal short film Moishe and stepped into a world of unknowns.

Following some creative brainstorming we identified challenges that she was going to face. It was clear that Maya needed a Colorist, so we appealed to our global database, and received over 30 applications from creators who wanted to help.

Supported with a range of complementary Filmworkz tools, Diego Pena, set to work for the final stage providing expertise and technical resources that Maya couldn't afford, which mean that the film was ready for its premiere by May 2023.

With a Filmtalkz podcast interview already in the bag and a supporting article on our website, we've been distributing Moishe across all our marketing channels, spanning its reach across the globe.

And we haven't stopped there: we're continuously available to lend our support to our Incredible Creators, and now that the film's complete, we were able to host a premiere of the film and a Q&A at one of the Everyman Cinemas in London.

We were so proud to be a part of this project and following our support, Maya has been on tour across the UK going to a variety of film festivals. We can't wait for the next project...







Barcelone-based colorist & Academy member Diego Peña was investigating using Phoenix for a restoration project when he saw the post looking for a colorist to support Maya's film; he applied immediately and the rest is history

Working on 'Moishe' was a beautiful experience. The Director of Photography would send over references and together we'd make something incredible despite speaking a different language. It was interesting to work with 19th century light devices such as oil lamps and kerosene lamps to shape light all along the scenes. Finally during the process and through each color version, all of us have been discovering the final look of the film. Whilst I was helping a first time director, it was also a great opportunity for me to work on a project like this.

OLIVER SCHMITZ

'WE WEREN'T LOOKING FOR POLITICS; THAT CAME TO US. IT INSPIRED ME EVEN MORE BECAUSE IT MADE ME SEE That cinema & film making has power in fighting censorship'

Oliver Schmitz is a South African Director and Screenwriter, who found fame in 1988 with the release of Mapantsula. It's considered to be the first anti-apartheid feature film by, for, and about black South Africans, and tells the story of Panic, a petty gangster who inevitably becomes caught up in the growing anti-apartheid struggle and must choose between individual gain and a united stand against the system.

The film originally debuted in the Official Selection at the Cannes Film Festival to massive critical acclaim and is often studied in film schools due to its artistic value and expression of the South African struggle.

Growing up during apartheid affected all aspects of Oliver's life, which was why running his nightclub Scratch as a young man that circumvented the race laws that divided the society was so significant. Despite ruining Oliver's hearing forever, it was:

'an incredible experience for us as young people, that suddenly we got to know each other, which had always been forbidden and everything was done to prevent that'.

Oliver joined host **Sophia Stanford** on Filmtalkz to take her through the process of putting this film back together; explaining the complications and considerations that come with restoration, from dirt and dust to changes in the negative. It was an opportunity for Oliver to revisit his masterpiece and for our community to appreciate it in all its glory.


